## PASTOR'S LETTER REV. CRAIG JONES

### “Try a Little Kindness”

One thing this old world needs is a little more kindness. As I observe humanity, I am amazed at how kind some people are. I'm also amazed at how unkind some people can be.

Kindness is defined, *“of a friendly, generous, benevolent, or gentle nature”* – *“showing friendliness, affection, or consideration.”* The Bible says that “kindness” is a *“fruit of the Spirit.”* This means that when the Spirit of Jesus Christ lives within us, the natural result of “living in the Spirit” will be that we will be kind in our speech toward others, that we will give people the benefit of the doubt, that we will *“do unto others as you would have them do unto you.”*

In another translation of The Golden Rule, found in Matthew 7:12, it says this, *“In everything, therefore, treat people the same way you want them to treat you, for this is the Law and the Prophets.”* Commenting on this verse, Dr. Charles Stanley, adds, **“If we want to be treated kindly, we must treat others with kindness. If we want to be given the benefit of the doubt, we must give others the benefit of the doubt. If we want good things for us, we must want good things for others.”**

Luci Swindoll, the sister of pastor and author, Chuck Swindoll, says it best: **“Be nice to one another, just be nice. Say nice things to one another.”**

It's time to make New Year's resolutions for 2010. Let me suggest that each of us puts **“kindness”** at that head of our list. I love the sign that Dr. Harry Evans of Trinity College in Deerfield, Illinois, has in his office: **“KINDNESS SPOKEN HERE.”**

See you at the place Sunday where we *“speak and show kindness”* to one another!

### “The Pattern for Powerful Prayer”

Colossians 1:9-14

There are times when we are at a loss for words when we go before our heavenly Father. We want to pray, but we don't know what to say.

In his letter to the Colossians, Paul outlined six requests that we can make which will push us closer to God and understand more of what He wants to do with our lives.

*Be filled with the knowledge of His will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding.* (v. 9) Asking God for direction is something we must always keep at the forefront of our prayers.

*Walk worthy of the Lord.* (v. 10) We all need the Holy Spirit to remind us if our lives are reflecting the beauty and love that God has poured into us. And holding ourselves accountable before the Lord is the best place to start.

*Bear fruit in every good work.* (v. 10) We always want to produce results, and by asking God for this, we see if our life investments are paying dividends in the lives of others.

*Increase in the knowledge of God.* (v. 10) Not until God totally transforms us into His image in heaven are we complete. We can always learn more about Him.

*Be strengthened with all power according to His glorious might.* (v. 11)

*Give thanks to the Father.* (v. 12) Walking in the attitude of thanksgiving before God keeps us humble and reminds us who is our provider.

## The Road to Westfed

Although the Westfed Pantry is open only twice a month, it takes many volunteer hours to collect donated items, shop, and pack grocery bags for distribution. Each member church is assigned specific items to provide for the month. When CUMC's baskets are short of needed items, your cash donations supplement additional purchases.

During the second half of 2009, we packed bags for 80 families every month.

When you read the "Westfed Needs" in the bulletin for January (crackers, toothpaste) -- this means CUMC's goal is to provide 80 boxes of crackers and 80 tubes of toothpaste. Sometimes there are extras left from the previous month on pantry shelves, but more often, the shelf is bare. When CUMC (or any other church) falls short in donations, the Westfed Pantry community cash donations help fill the gap. This year, that gap was \$350/month. After inventorying shelves on packing day, representatives shop for additional items and are reimbursed by the Westfed Treasurer.

Due to increased cash donations from the community in 2009, each family was given a \$10 Kroger gift card designated for a meat purchase at Thanksgiving and at Christmas. This had not been possible the previous year. For these two holidays, a third bag of seasonal grocery items was also provided.

CUMC's Thanksgiving food frenzy bags provided 47 cans of pumpkin, 83 bars of soap, 67 cans of tuna, 59 cake mixes, 52 boxes of crackers, and 83 boxes of jello.

The pantry serves families in zip codes 45211 and 45238 on the third and fourth Thursdays of the month. Families may come either day, but only once a month. Supplies are limited and this year has seen a large increase in new families seeking help. If you'd like to visit the pantry for a firsthand look at your donations in action, please call me.
